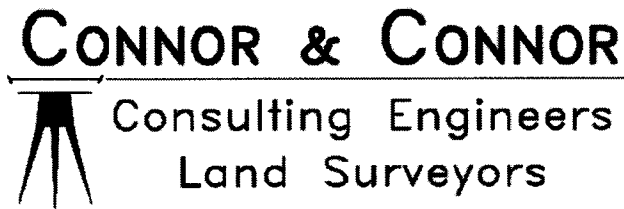

WAGE RATES

SHALL BE CHANGED:

Wage rates shall be replaced with the updated schedule attached.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS:

The following questions have been presented to the ENGINEER, and the subsequent answers have been given, to the best of our knowledge and belief:

Q#1 Is the Water District tax-exempt, and may we have their exemption information?

A. Yes, the Water District is tax-exempt, and their information will be made available to the successful bidder.

Q#2 Would you explain the requirements for tree and brush clearing?

A. All right-of-ways shall be cleared for the installation, operation and maintenance of the water system. The right-of-way shall be cleared from the location of the water main to the edge of the roadway surface, except on state owned property. The clearing shall include, but not be limited to all trees, tree limbs, tree stumps, and brush. At the discretion of the ENGINEER some trees larger than twenty-four (24) inches in diameter may be left, but for the purpose of bidding, the CONTRACTOR shall assume all trees will be removed.

Q#3 Explain the pay items for "Limestone and Fertilizer" and "Seeding and Mulching"?

A. "Limestone and Fertilizer" shall be applied to all areas disturbed by the project including all lawns, fields, timber areas, etc. The "Seeding and Mulching" shall be applied to all lawns, hay fields, and timber areas. In the areas where "Seeding and Mulching" is required, "Limestone and Fertilizer" will also be paid for, both as field measured in place.

Q#4 Is the overflow pipe on the water tower required to be run down the cent of

a leg?

A. No. The tank contractor should plan to construct the overflow pipe in their standard way of construction.

Q#5 What is the correct elevation for the top of footer for the proposed water tower?

A. The correct elevation is 581.0'.
